Brief Description:

This preparatory assistance (PA) project is to initiate activities in support of the Government's efforts to fight corruption. The PA aims to provide initial support to the Government, particularly the recently established Anti-Corruption Body, in launching its fight against corruption by the deployment of an anti-corruption assessment mission to Afghanistan. The Anti-Corruption mission, consisting of two experts to be deployed to Afghanistan for a period of 1 month, will assist the Head of the Anti-Corruption Body, Dr. Ludin, in making a preliminary assessment of the situation in Afghanistan in terms of corruption and the needs arising there from. Thereby, the experts will provide substantial input for the formulation of a National Anti-Corruption Strategy.

This PA covers activities limited to the deployment of the anti-corruption assessment mission. Any further activities in support of the government's fight against corruption based on the outcomes/findings of the assessment mission fall outside its framework. These may, upon request of the government, be incorporated in a project document for the support of the fight against corruption. In the latter case, this PA will be due to last until activities described in the project document are ready to be implemented.

I- SITUATION ANALYSIS

CONTEXT:

Evidence from across the globe confirms that corruption hinders economic development, reduces social services, and diverts investments in infrastructure, institutions and social services. Moreover it fosters an antidemocratic environment characterized by uncertainty, unpredictability and declining moral values and disrespects for constitutional institutions and authority.

The Afghan Government is focusing on public sector administration reform at all levels. Fighting corruption within the government is one of its most challenging endeavors.

UNDP has been asked to provide support to the newly appointed anti-corruption body within the Office of the President with a mission to assess the Afghanistan specific needs and advise the President's Office on feasible options for strengthening anti corruption efforts in Afghanistan.

In order for the Afghan government to fight corruption, it is important to understand the causes of corruption in the Afghan specific context to ensure that any planned interventions or reforms address the roots of the problem. In depth assessment of the political, social, cultural economic context is a prerequisite to better understand the different parameters of the corruption problem and the key institutions involved, in order to define preventive measures and design an anti corruption strategy tailored to the specific needs of Afghanistan. Especially when available baseline data on the Afghan specific situation is very limited.

Based on the in depth assessments, the anti-corruption body under the leadership of Dr. Ludin will draft a national anti-corruption strategy, which will outline specific measures to be undertaken in the fight against corruption.

PA OBJECTIVES:

The overall objective of the project is:

To support the Afghan government in assessing the situation in Afghanistan with regard to corruption and the measures to be taken through the facilitation of technical expertise and the deployment of an anti-corruption assessment mission in July/August 2004.

PA STRATEGY:

In view of developing a national anti-corruption strategy and strengthening the capacity of the newly established anti-corruption unit at the Office of the President, a thorough assessment of the current situation with regard to corruption in Afghanistan (at all levels) is required to identify the needs and activities to fight corruption.

As a first measure, an anti-corruption assessment mission, facilitated through UNDP in consultation with the head of the anti-corruption body, will be conducted to assess the systemic vulnerabilities to corruption in the specific context of re-building (or strengthening) governance institutions and process in Afghanistan. The initial assessment will also aim to provide key strategic recommendations on priority areas for reform (immediate targets), based on a long-term, holistic initial framework for institutionalizing accountability, transparency and integrity in public service in Afghanistan. The proposed long-term framework will take the form of a strategic outline/basis for discussions and consultations by the larger coalition and/or integrity working group to be developed. The experts participating in the mission will advise the President's office on feasible options for strengthening anti corruption efforts in Afghanistan and provide technical expertise to the anti-corruption unit, thereby strengthening its capacity to implement its mandate, in particular the drafting of a national anti-corruption strategy.

Under the PA, UNDP will:

Provide expert technical assistance to the Afghan Government and its anticorruption body in the area of anti-corruption through the facilitation of an anticorruption mission.
